Block 2 Co-curricular activities Selection Letter - March 2022

Please find the information regarding co-curricular activities (Term 3 & 4), including details of signing up, procedures and guidelines for extracurricular activities.

We are introducing co-curricular activities in Term 3 & 4, for KS1 and up (Year 1- Year 13). Also, we will be mixing year groups in the activities (largely in YG pairs) in Term 3. Secondary clubs will be for KS groups. Sign up is for both internal and external activities at the same time. We are looking at running 46 co-curricular activities for primary students and 66 co-curricular activities for secondary students. There is no charge for activities offered by our own school staff. Those run by external coaches will be charged as set out below and will need to have a minimum number of students to run. The charge is per term per student in Nepali Rupees.

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How to sign up for Term 3 (Block 2) Co-curricular Activities

Parent Portal

- 1. Once you have reached the Engage Portal site, please login using your Engage username and password.
- 2. Please click on 'Book Activities' located just below your child's photograph.
- 3. Now select each child individually (if you have more than one) and select the correct Academic year **2021/22** and finally click on **Term 3**
- 4. Choose the day on which you see your child's year group.
- 5. You will now be able to choose from the range of clubs.
- 6. There will be a couple of options for your child's year group and it will be a lottery system. There is no guarantee that your child will get a club on each day.
- 7. The sign up will open at 9am on Wednesday 9th March and close at 2pm Friday 11th March.
- 8. You will receive a confirmation email on Friday,11th March by 5pm.
- 9. You will be able to check the activity for your child on the Engage Parent Portal thereafter.
- 10.If, for whatever reason, you are unable to respond via the parent portal please contact skhanal@tbs.edu.np for the parent portal and clubs@tbs.edu.np for the activities.

As always, we encourage full attendance at the activities once they are selected. Those who do not attend regularly without a valid reason will be removed from that club list (if they miss 3 sessions) and the place given to a student on the waiting list. Organising the co-curricular activities system is a huge task and would not continue to run so well without the support of all parents. We appreciate this and we are always open to any feedback that you can give (clubs@tbs.edu.np).

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Frequently asked Questions & Guidelines for co-curricular activities

- 1. How do parents/students select co-curricular activities and how do they work? They take place from 2.30-3.30pm (primary) and 3.30-4.30pm (secondary). Block 1 runs in Term 1 & 2, Block 2 in Term 3 and Block 3 in Term 4. The 3 blocks usually run for about 10 weeks.
- 2. How do we actually sign up? We have the information above. We have a <u>Parent Portal guide</u> that should make the process more efficient.
- 3. Is there a charge for activities? Activities offered by school staff are usually provided without charge as part of the school's core offer. If external providers are used, the charge is linked to their costs.
- 4. What are the expectations of students during activities? It is important that students know they are expected to follow the same rules and show the same respect to coaches and the leaders as they would to their class teachers. We will talk to children and their parents if they seem to be struggling to cope with their behavior in the activities but we expect this to be rare.

Finally, we hope this information sheet helps parents and children understand how co-curricular activities work.
