Dear Parents and Carers,

KS1 Day Trip and Camp TBS: 14th March and 15th March 2024

Parent Information session: Wednesday 28th February 2024 at 2:40pm in the Primary library

(This will be followed by a Parent Information Session on our upcoming Year 1 and Year 2 Relationship and Sex Education Programme)

We are very excited to inform you that we are planning to take the children on a day trip, followed by an overnight sleepover at the school on **Thursday 14th March**. There will be a parent information session about this trip on **Wednesday 28th February** at **2:40pm** in the Primary library. This experience is part of the children's social education and will be important preparation for any future residential trips that they may undertake. We fully appreciate that for some children this will be their first overnight stay away from their parents and we wish to reassure you that they will be in the best of care to enable them to get the most out of the experience. The trip and sleepover will cover many areas of the curriculum including PSHE, PE, Geography and Science and we will use the trip to do follow up work back in school.

The children will come to school as normal on Thursday 14th March, dressed in comfortable clothes and shoes, they will need to pack a **water bottle, packed lunch, snack, hat** and **suncream** for the day in a small bag. They will also need to bring with them their overnight bag for Camp TBS back at school. We will return to school in the afternoon for an afternoon and evening programme of events and the experience of camping at school. The children will sleep in a tent on the school campus. Dinner on Thursday and breakfast and snack on Friday morning will be provided at school. The KS1 sleepover will conclude after snack and we ask that children are collected at **10am on Friday 15th March**. Past experience has shown that the children are usually very tired by this time and that they would struggle with further activities.

The children's clothes, toiletries, cuddly toy etc. for the night stay should be in their overnight bag, this should be a separate bag, which your child will bring to school on the morning of Thursday 14th of March. **All bags and clothing must be clearly marked with your child's name.** Bags will be placed in a safe place at school whilst the children are away on their day trip.

It is essential that we are aware of any medical conditions that your child may have. Please inform us of any medication they may be taking. **Also, please put any medication in a clearly named and labelled plastic bag, with dosage instructions, and hand it to your child's class teacher on the**
